



HELP WEATHER THE PERFECT STORM

The Time is NOW. Helpline House is sending out an urgent Call to Action as it navigates economic uncertainty, skyrocketing grocery prices, and a 25 percent increase in households to support. All while the food bank is undergoing a reduction of over 40% in the Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP) commodities and has lost its Local Food Purchase Assistance (LFPA) resources.

"Food insecurity is at an all-time high," says Helpline House Food Bank Manager Lianne Ristow. "Our community's support is needed now more than ever. We don't have enough food to serve our community, especially meats, dairy and fruit supplies."

"Helpline House **fed 851 families with 972,835 pounds** of food last year," the Executive Director Maria Metzler said, noting that demand is already trending higher this year.

Helpline House remains dedicated to supporting everyone who is experiencing food insecurity, but is facing several challenges:

- Government support that Helpline House has relied on for years is in jeopardy.
- Food prices are going up.

 Anxiety among clients is on the rise. "Folks have lost their jobs and are scrambling for what's next," Ristow says.

Ristow describes the dramatic increase in the number of households served each week by Helpline House as coupled with the equally challenging decrease in the supply chain. "It's impossible to predict when we might lose certain [commodities] and how this will affect our food bank operations," says Ristow. "As a result, we can't stock our food bank as much as we have in the past."

A Growing Need for Financial Assistance

Since the start of 2025, appointments for energy financial assistance at Helpline House have increased over 50% compared to last year. This increase reflects the mounting economic pressure many neighbors are facing, especially with rising utility and rent costs.

Our Case Management team walks alongside clients, offering personalized support with Social Security applications, rental and utility assistance, and referrals across the Kitsap Peninsula. As costs rise, more families are seeking help.

"It's a privilege to support our neighbors when they need it most," says Zoe, an experienced case manager. Recently, the team helped an elderly gentleman transition from living on a boat to securing safe, long-term housing, along with access to his Social Security benefits.
